

SKILLS FOR THE FUTURE

Education and skills are essential for young people's prospects in life and in the labour market. Diverse skills are needed for innovation, competitiveness, and the green and digital transitions. Citizenship skills support democracy and empower young people to exercise their rights and responsibilities in society.

Many young people complete formal education...

4 in 10 young people (15-34) completed upper secondary and post-secondary non-tertiary education



4 in 10 young people (25-29) completed tertiary education

Non-formal education

Skills are also developed outside of the traditional education system.

For example, youth activities, volunteering and sport all foster citizenship skills, teamwork, leadership, intercultural communication and resilience.
